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ADJUDICATION ORDER

Pursuant to a meeting of the Ohio Architects Board, the following matter came before the Board on January 17, 2014. Members of the Board present were: Richard J. Fleischman, Stephen L. Sharp, Richard L. Bowen and John P. Rademacher.

ORDER OF THE BOARD

Richard J. Fleischman, Stephen L. Sharp, Richard L. Bowen and John P. Rademacher reviewed and considered the Report and Recommendation of the hearing officer, the case exhibits and the written objection submitted by Mr. White.

Thereupon, the Board took the following actions in this matter:

1. The Board approves and adopts the findings of fact, conclusions of law and recommendations as set forth in the hearing officer's report.
2. The Board hereby orders Larry J. White to pay in full, a fine of \$1,000.00 (One-Thousand Dollars) no later than March 21, 2014 via credit card, check or money order made payable to the "Treasurer, State of Ohio".
3. The Board hereby orders Larry J. White to successfully complete the NCARB monograph, "*Ethics and Professional Rules of Conduct: Distinction and Clarification*" and provide the certificate of completion to the Board no later than March 21, 2014. The CE hours earned will not count towards the 2014 requirements.

4. The failure of Larry J. White to comply with any of the above terms and deadlines will result in an immediate and indefinite suspension of his certificate of qualification to practice architecture until such time as all the requirements have been met.

TIME AND METHOD TO PERFECT AN APPEAL

Any party desiring to appeal shall file a Notice of Appeal with the Ohio Architects Board, 77 South High Street, 16th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43215-6108, setting forth the order appealed from and stating the Board's order is not supported by reliable, probative, and substantial evidence and is not in accordance with law.

The Notice of Appeal may, but need not, set forth the specific grounds of the party's appeal beyond the statement that the Board's order is not supported by reliable, probative and substantial evidence and is not in accordance with law.

The Notice of Appeal shall also be filed by the appellant with the Court of Common Pleas in the county of the appellant's place of business, or in the county in which the appellant is a resident, or with the Court of Common Pleas in Franklin County, Ohio if not a resident of Ohio. Such notices of appeal shall be filed within fifteen (15) days after the mailing of the notice of the Board's order as provided in Section 119.12 of the Ohio Revised Code.
